What is the CRRSA Act?

- The **Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act** was enacted on December 27, 2020
- The **Education Stabilization Fund (ESF)** received an **additional ~\$82B** across the three main education grant programs:

Education Stabilization Fund (ESF)	
CARES Act (\$30.75 billion)	CRRSA Act (\$82 billion)
ESSER - \$13.5 billion	ESSER II - \$54.3 billion
GEER - \$3 billion	GEER II - \$4.05 billion
HEER - \$14.2 billion	HEER II - \$22.7 billion

- The new recovery bill also extended CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) until December 31, 2021



ESSER II Update

Arizona's ESSER II Award: \$1,149,715,947

- ESSER II Funds remain highly flexible, and are designed to help address **local recovery efforts** relative to responding to **COVID-19**
- Arizona's award is based on Arizona's proportionate share of Title I-A funds received in **FY21 (SY20-21)** - which is why our new award is not exactly 4x ESSER I
- **90%** of Arizona's award (**\$1,034,744,352.30**) must be **sub-granted to LEAs**
 - Funds are allocated based on each LEA's proportionate share of Title I-A funds received in FY21 (SY20-21)
- **9.5%** of the total award may be reserved for ADE **state-level activities** to support K-12 **COVID-19 recovery** efforts
- No more than **0.5%** of the total award may be reserved by ADE for **administrative costs**



ESSER II Update

Breakdown of Arizona's ESSER II Award:

Total Award	\$1,149,715,947.00
Total SEA Admin (0.5%)	\$ 5,748,579.74
Total SEA Activities (9.5%)	\$109,223,014.97
Total LEA Assistance (90%)	\$1,034,744,352.30

Initial Project Term: March 13, 2020 – September 30, 2022

Funds will remain available for obligation through **September 30, 2023**

LEAs should be mindful in their local planning that ESSER I funds expire first, on September 30, 2022, as opposed to September 30, 2023 for ESSER II.

NOTE: The Auditor General's Office has established **new fund codes** for ESSER II (336) and GEER II (337), as these funds must be tracked separately from original CARES Act funds



ESSER II LEA Allocations Methodology

Step 1: Make Initial Required Allocations for FY21 Title I-A Grantees

Initial LEA subgrant allocations are required to be based on each LEA's **proportionate share of Title I-A funds** received in FY21 (SY20-21) (*LEAs must complete and submit their FY21 ESEA Consolidated Application for Title I-A*)

Step 2: Allocations for FY21 Non-Title I-A Grantees

Initial Formula:

- Determine Per Pupil Amount (PPA) based on 50% of the Total Final Adjusted Poverty count for the FY21 Title I-A Cohort (*Total for Required ESSER II LEA Assistance / Total Adjusted Poverty*). Apply the 50% PPA to SY19-20 poverty count for Non-Title I-A LEAs, while ensuring a minimum 'hold-harmless' poverty rate of 20% (the state average poverty rate for the FY21 Title I-A LEA cohort)

Minimum Support Level Determinations:

- Ensure **all Small LEAs and CTED Entities** receive a minimum of **\$150,000**
- Ensure **all Rural LEAs** receive a minimum of **\$175,000**
- Ensure **all Rural and Remote LEAs** receive a minimum of **\$200,000**

Step 3: Title I-A LEA Grantees Adjustments

- Ensure all FY21 Title I-A LEAs meet the 50% PPA used to determine initial Non-Title I-A LEA allocations
- Apply the minimum support level determinations to all FY21 Title I-A Small, Rural and Rural and Remote LEAs



ESSER II Allocations Methodology

ESSER II Allocations Summary

	Required Allocation	Adjustment from SEA Reserve	Total Allocation
Title I-A LEAs	\$1,034,744,352.30	\$8,951,276.52	\$1,043,695,628.69
Non-Title I-A LEAs		\$35,119,058.60	\$35,119,058.60
CTED Entities		\$4,925,355.54	\$4,925,355.54
TOTAL ALL		\$48,995,690.66 (~45% of SEA Activities Reserve)	\$1,083,740,042.83

ESSER II allocations are estimated to be ~3x a mid to large-sized Title I-A LEA's Title I-A award (prior to adjustments)

Adjustments were made using the SEA Reserve to ensure:

Small LEAs and CTED Entities receive a minimum baseline award of \$150K, or ~3x their ESSER I award

Small, Rural LEAs receive an additional \$25K above the minimum baseline for a total of \$175K

Small, Rural and Remote LEAs receive an additional \$50K above the baseline for a total of \$200K



Determining Local Needs

- ESSER II Funds are highly flexible, and are designed to help address local **recovery efforts** relative to responding to **COVID-19**
- ESSER II Funds can be used **throughout the LEA**, in **all schools** and in support of **all students and staff**
- **Supplement and not supplant** requirements **do not apply** to LEA use of ESSER Fund monies
- LEAs are encouraged to review their **Comprehensive Needs Assessments (CNAs)** through the lens of responding to COVID-19 to identify critical areas of need that can be addressed system-wide
- Once local school and LEA needs and activities are determined, the LEA should update their school and LEA **Integrated Action Plans (IAPs)**, using the **COVID funding tag**. This will help to identify opportunities to leverage a braided funding approach, across multiple funding sources, to help support identified local needs and activities systemwide

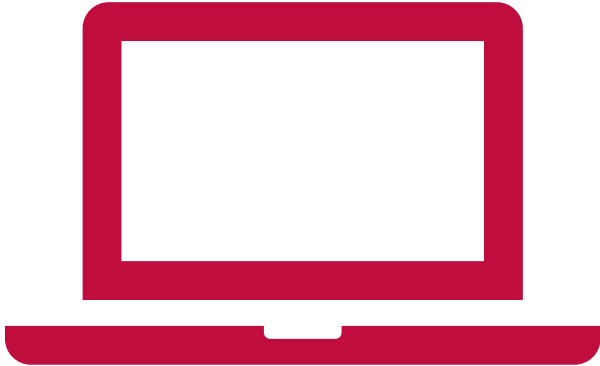

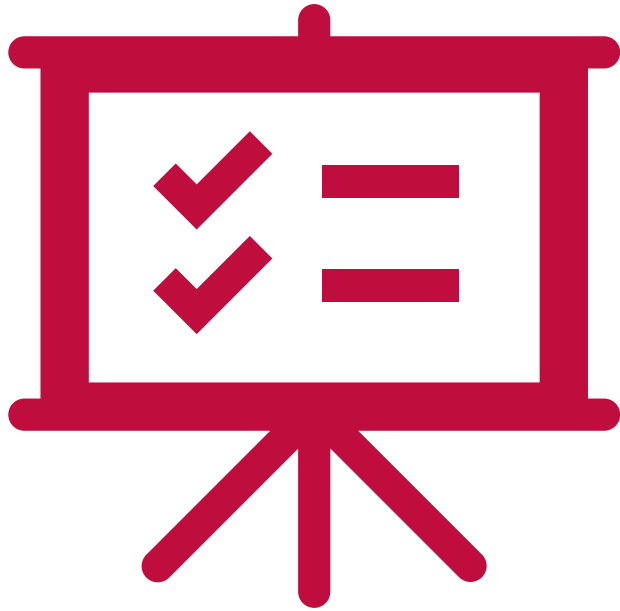

LEA Allowable Uses of ESSER II Funds

ESSER II Fund monies are flexible, and may be used by LEAs for any of the following categories depending on local needs:

✓ **Any activity allowed under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)**

e.g.: Title I-A, Title I-C (Migrant Education), Title I-D (Neglected and Delinquent Students), Title II-A, Title III-A (English Language Learners), Title IV-A, Title IV-B 21st Century Community Learning Centers, Title V-B REAP (SRSA and RLIS), Title VI-A (Indian Education), Title VII (Impact Aid)

✓ **Any activity allowed under the following Federal education acts:**

- Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)
- Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act (Perkins Act)
- McKinney Vento Homeless Assistance Act
- Adult Education and Family Literacy Act
- Native Hawaiian Education Act and the Alaska Native Educational Equity, Support, and Assistance Act



LEA Allowable Uses of ESSER II Funds

- ESSER II Funds may also be used by LEAs for the following COVID-19 related relief, prevention, and recovery efforts:
 - ✓ **Coordination of preparedness and response** efforts of local educational agencies with State, local, Tribal, and territorial public health departments, and other relevant agencies, to improve coordinated responses among such entities to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus
 - ✓ Providing principals and others school leaders with the resources necessary to address the **needs of individual schools**
 - ✓ Activities to **address the unique needs** of low-income children or students, children with disabilities, English learners, racial and ethnic minorities, students experiencing homelessness, and foster care youth, including how outreach and service delivery will meet the needs of each population



LEA Allowable Uses of ESSER II Funds

- ✓ Developing and implementing procedures and systems to **improve the preparedness** and response efforts of LEAs
- ✓ **Training and professional development** for staff of the LEA on sanitation and minimizing the spread of infectious diseases
- ✓ **Purchasing supplies to sanitize and clean** the facilities of an LEA, including buildings operated by such an agency
- ✓ **Planning for and coordinating during long term closures**, including meals to eligible students, technology for online learning, guidance for carrying out requirements under the IDEA, and how to ensure other educational services can continue to be provided consistent with all federal, state, and local requirements



LEA Allowable Uses of ESSER II Funds

- ✓ **Purchasing educational technology** (including hardware, software, and connectivity) for students that aids in regular and substantive educational interaction between students and their classroom instructors, including low-income students and students with disabilities, which may include assistive technology or adaptive equipment
- ✓ **Providing mental health services and supports**
- ✓ **Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental after school programs**, including providing classroom instruction or online learning during the summer months and addressing the needs of low-income students, students with disabilities, English learners, migrant students, students experiencing homelessness, and children in foster care



LEA Allowable Uses of ESSER II Funds

- CRSSA highlights several ‘new’ LEA uses of funds (*however, these ‘new’ activities are also allowable under ESSER I*). These activities include:
 - ✓ **Addressing learning loss** among students, including by:
 - Administering and using high-quality, valid and reliable assessments
 - Implementing evidence-based activities to meet comprehensive needs of students
 - Providing assistance to parents and families on how to effectively support students, including in distance learning environments
 - Tracking student attendance and improving student engagement in distance learning
 - ✓ **School facilities repair and improvement** to enable safe operation of schools
 - ✓ Inspection, testing, maintenance, repair, replacement, and upgrade **projects to improve the indoor air quality in school facilities**



LEA Allowable Uses of ESSER II Funds

- Other activities that are necessary to **maintain the operation of and continuity of services** in LEAs and continuing to employ existing staff of the LEA

Note: Supplement and not supplant requirements do not apply to LEA use of ESSER Fund monies

ESSER II funds are subject to the Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR) and the federal government's Uniform Grant Guidance (UGG), including the requirement that spending be **necessary and reasonable**

ESSER II does not include a local Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirement. LEAs are not required to maintain effort to receive ESSER II funds. LEAs must, however, continue to comply with Maintenance of Effort requirements in other federal education laws such as ESEA and IDEA



LEA Unallowable Uses of ESSER II Funds

The following are unallowable uses of ESSER II Funds:

- CARES Act funds generally cannot be used for bonuses, merit pay, or similar expenditures, unless related to disruptions or closures resulting from COVID-19
- Subsidizing or offsetting executive salaries and benefits of individuals who are not employees of the SEA or LEAs
- Expenditures related to state or local teacher or faculty unions or associations

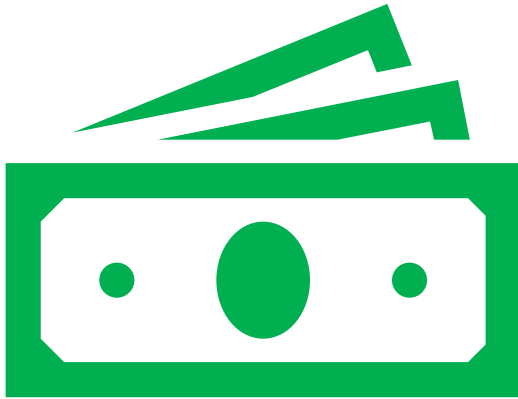

Budget Notes



Be sure to **code all expenses properly** per the **USFR**

Submit **Revisions** for any **fiscal or programmatic change**

Receive grant approval for revisions **prior** to implementing **any change** in spending or activities

In accordance with sound accounting practices, LEAs should plan to **request regular reimbursements**

Keep necessary **Time and Effort** documentation

The initial obligation date for the ESSER Fund grant is March 13, 2020

Substantial approval is required prior to any expenditures





Budget Narrative Details

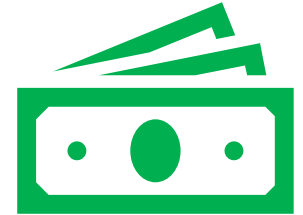


Budget Narrative Details – Select Examples

Salaries

Example: *For each position type:*

- # of Positions x Average Salary x # of Months = Total or
- .FTE x Average Salary x # of Years = Total



Supplies

- ✓ Provide a **mid-level** of disaggregated detail to ensure items are coded properly

Examples: Face Masks (\$20,000), Hand Sanitizer (\$10,000), Desk Shields (\$50,000)

- ✓ Provide an **average per-unit cost** where needed to help ensure items with a per-unit cost of \$5,000 or more are properly coded

‘Bundled Expenses’

- ✓ Expenses may be bundled based on the largest contributing factor to the total cost

Example: Hot Spots devices and services that are bundled together may be coded to 6500, given the cost of service is the largest proportion of the total bundle cost



Prior to Grant Submission

- ✓ Ensure **FY21 GSA** is uploaded to GME
- ✓ Verify that the **FFATA *brief summary*** is completed
- ✓ Ensure all proposed **budgeted activities** are **coded properly** per the **USFR or USFRCS** (charter LEAs)
- ✓ Verify that **Program Narrative Questions** sections have been completed based on your budgeted activities
- ✓ Update your **School and LEA IAPs** using the **COVID funding tag**
 - ✓ **NOTE: This is not required for an application to be initially approved** – but should be completed to support the LEA’s implementation of their local plans and activities

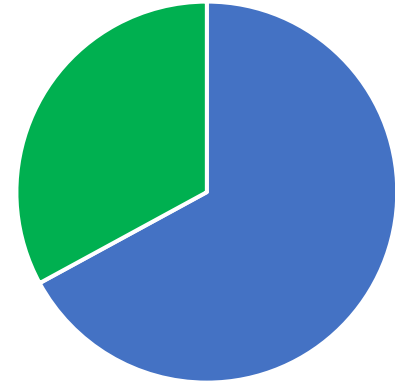

Summary of Most Common LEA Uses of ESSER I Funds to Date

- **Reimbursement of Expenses Related to School Closures**
- **Support for Distance and Remote Learning**
 - Devices, Software, Internet Service / Hotspots, IT Support Infrastructure & Security
 - Professional Learning for Teachers and Administrators
 - Technology Support for Students and Families
- **PPE and Safety Supplies**
 - Face masks, face shields, plexiglass, gloves, gowns, thermometers, hand sanitizer
- **Cleaning / Disinfecting Supplies & Equipment, Facilities Costs**
 - Cleaning supplies and equipment, HVAC systems upgrades, air purifiers, water bottle filling stations
- **Food Services Costs**
- **Salary Expenses**
 - Expanded duties, retention, additional staffing needs
- **Transportation Expenses**
- **SEL and Mental Health Supports**



Next Steps

Actions to Consider Now

- ✓ Continue to submit ESSER I applications for approval
- ✓ Revise applications, as needed, to help manage local needs
- ✓ Draw down your ESSER I Funds as needed on a timely and *ongoing* basis
- ✓ Leverage other Federal funds, such as Title I-A and IV-A, to support local needs (e.g. *PPE, distance learning supports*)
- ✓ Create your plan and complete your application for ESSER II funds

Ongoing Efforts by ADE and Stakeholders

- Continued advocacy for additional Federal and State recovery funds
- Seek continued and extended fiscal Federal grant flexibility from USED
- ADE will continue to provide resources to LEAs to help navigate the safe re-opening of schools, and in supporting student learning, staff and families throughout the pandemic and beyond



Next Steps

ADE is committed to working collaboratively to support schools to use these new funds effectively and strategically to meet immediate needs and to make thoughtful, sustainable investments in support of ongoing local recovery efforts
